These issues along with the First Day Cover and the information sheet, at Rs 2 each, shall be available on sale at nearly 1000 selected Post Offices including all Philatelic Bureaus and Counters in the country.

CHILDREN' DAY STAMP RELEASED

India Post released a special stamp on the national Children's Day on November 14, 2004 in the denomination of Rs 5.

November 14 is the birthday of India's first Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru and is traditionally celebrated as the national Children's Day. India Post has been issuing stamps on Children's Day since 1957. Since 1973 most stamps issued on Children's Day are designed by children. India Post organizes an all India Stamp Design Competition on a given theme. This year's theme was 'My Village'. The design adjudged best is adopted for the stamp and the second best for the First Day Cover.

S Vindhya designed the stamp, and Sudha Singh designed the First Day Cover. Alka Sharma designed the pictorial first day postmark. Brochure containing write-up and technical data was issued on the occasion. The First Day Cover and the Brochure are priced at Rs 2 each. India Security Press printed the stamps by Photo Gravure in the quantity of 3 million.

#### DECPEX

The Chief Postmaster General of Delhi Circle, Jyotsna Diesh inaugurated the District level philatelic exhibition organized by the Central Division on November 17, 2004 at Russian Centre for Science & Culture, Feroze Shah Road, New Delhi.

This is the  $2^{nd}$  district level in Delhi and was planned as combined show with the State level show for Youth Class but was later held as District level only.

The jury consisted of Vandita Kaul (Chairperson), Rajesh Singh (Assistant Post Master General), S L Bansal, and Madhukar Jhingan. The Best Exhibit Award and a Gold medal was won by Dwarka Prasad for Postal Censorship in 2<sup>nd</sup> World War in the senior class, the best Youth Exhibit and a Silver Medal was won by Sahil Thapar, and the Best School Collection award and a Bronze Medal was won by Hamdard Public School.

A special cover depicting New Delhi H O that is popularly known as Gol Dakkhana (Round Post Office) after its circular building was issued and utilized for all the three days of the exhibition. Special cancellations depicting a postman, a letter box, and a mail van were provided on first, second and third day respectively.

### FAKE STAMP SCAM UPDATES

Abdul Karim Telgi, the main accused in the fake stamp scam, has confessed to have acquired properties worth over Rs 1.2 billion, which he generated out of the crime according to the status report submitted to the Supreme Court by CBI on November 16, 2004. The report says that 76 front companies of the criminal network of Telgi have been identified across the country so far, conducting their business through 155 outlets. So far, 119 bank accounts with established credit inflow of Rs 6.2 billion have been disclosed to be maintained in respect of these companies. The report goes on to say that dubious roles and conduct of a large number of public servants and other persons in public life are being established through the investigations conducted by the CBI. It is being firmly indicated in a number of instances that the accused public servants had actively aided and abetted the organized crime syndicate of Telgi by way of obtaining pecuniary benefits.

SOME INTERESTING FACTS OF THE PHILATELIC WORLD...

#### THE WORLD'S FIRST POST BOX

Here is an interesting story about the World's First Post Box. It dates back to the year 1500 when a great Portuguese explorer Bartolemeu Dias who discovered the Cape of Good Hope drowned when his ship went down in a storm off the coast of South Africa. All went away with the storm except one of his ships. When the weather cleared and the storm calmed down this ship's captain decided to sail back home leaving the unfortunate expedition to an end. When they were leaving the bay one of the officers of the ship wrote about the disaster and the death of Dias in a long letter and put it in a shoe which he left hanging from a tree close to shore. The officer just expected that someday a European would find the letter and get detailed account of the tragic fate of the expedition. It was long way back to Portugal. If the surviving vessel had not left the details there would have been no record of the tragedy which had overtaken the explorers. But after a year a Portuguese navigator Jaao Da Nova who was in command of four ships on his way to India reached Mossel Bay where the tragedy took place. He found the letter in good condition deep inside the shoe, protected there from the ravages of both climate and insects. He came to know the details of the great disaster. Da Nova built a little church there. And settlement of Europeans gradually grew up around it. The shoe and the tree served as a post box for the growing colony and for the passing ships until it wore out. The great ancient tree still stands there but it has become a memorable place as South African Government has built a monument under its branches in honor of its use as the World' first post box. It is a concrete box with a plaque in the form of a big Portuguese Shoe. It is still used to deposit the mail.

# ALSO IN THE NEWS

## HONG KONG COINS AND CURRENCY

Hongkong Post has issued a unique Souvenir Pack on September 2, 2004. The Pack features five new stamps depicting historic Hong Kong coins and currency from the past 140 years. It also includes a newly designed \$20 banknote issued by the Hongkong and Shanghai Banking Corporation (HSBC).

The four-stamps in souvenir sheet commemorate historic Hong Kong coinage and currency including: the first Hong Kong bronze coin issued in 1863 on \$1.40 value; the first silver coin issued in 1866 on \$2.40 value; the first paper note issued by the Hong Kong Government in 1935 on \$3 value; and a \$5 gold coin commemorating the establishment of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (HKSAR) in 1997 on \$5 value. Also issued is a stamp sheetlet showcasing an HK \$5 stamp with an illustration of a commemorative HK \$10 coin issued in 1997 with images of six other HK coins, with values ranging from HK 10 cents to HK \$5, appear in the sheetlet's surround. The Pack includes a \$20 banknote featuring a majestic lion statue and traditional Chinese patterns.

Remarkably, the souvenir sheet and sheetlet have been printed with the same serial number that appears on the banknote, a most unusual feature, and one that is sure to be of particular interest to collectors.

The Pack is priced at HK \$60 and is available from Hong Kong Post.
