ALSO IN THE NEWS

SMITHSONIAN ACQUIRES LENNON'S STAMP ALBUM

The National Postal Museum has acquired John Lennon's childhood stamp album. In addition to more than 550 stamps from around the world, the album's flyleaf bears the name, address and signature of a young John Lennon.

Years before his rise to fame as a musician and member of the Beatles, Lennon was a schoolboy in Liverpool, England, when his cousin Stanley Parkes gave him a hardcover Mercury stamp album. The circa-1950 album originally belonged to Parkes, who encouraged Lennon's interest in stamp collecting. The album has 145 pages and features stamps from several countries including India, the United States and New Zealand.

In the years since the Museum's 1993 opening, some fascinating material has been acquired through generous donations and advantageous purchases. The most significant of these are reported to the Secretary of the Institution for inclusion in the yearly Annals.
