JAMSHEDPUR PHILATELIC SOCIETY MEETING

The monthly meeting of the Jamshedpur Philatelic Society was held at the residence of JPS member P S Nath on September 11, 2005. At the beginning of the meeting two minutes silence was observed to pay respect to the recently departed great philatelists P Gupta and Major S C Mohanty who had contributed a lot towards the promotion of Philately in India especially amongst the school children.

The recent stamp issue program of India Post was discussed. The members have taken a serious view that there is not even a single stamp relating to Jharkhand and although a lot of proposals have already been submitted to India Post for consideration but do not find place in the said program. It has been decided to highlight this in appropriate forum.

The Guru Granth Saheb stamp and miniature sheet that is not yet officially released was also discussed. The members were of the view that India Post should neither declare these as illegal or unauthorized nor ban its usage in prepayment of postage and inclusion in philatelic exhibits. Whatever stamps and miniature sheets that are in circulation have been fully paid for and obtained by the public including philatelists from the post offices.

The meeting concluded with high tea offered by the host. As the 2^{nd} Sunday falls on the festival day, the meeting for the month of October is rescheduled to October 16, 2005 at the office of Rahul De, Shova International, Vistupur.

PHILATELIC WORKSHOP AT BHUBANESWAR

A Philatelic Workshop was organized by the Postal Department on 26.09.2005 at DAV Public School, Pokhariput, Bhubaneswar as scheduled. The Workshop was ianugurated by the Chaiman of DAV Schools, Orissa. Senior Philatelists Mr. B.K.Sinha, Ajit Kumar Dash, Anil Kumar Dhir and Anup Kumar Raut attended the work shop and explained with practical demonstration about the procedure of collection, preservation of stamps, how to take care of them and how to display in an exhibition. At last a Philatelic Quiz competetion was also held amongst the students. About 50 students attended the workshop. The DPS Mr Suvendu Swain, IPS of Bhubaneswar Circle presided over the Velidictory Sessions and distributed prizes to the students.

ALSO IN THE NEWS

BRITISH CRICKET VICTORY STAMPS

British Royal Mail is releasing a set of four stamps on October 6, 2005 to commemorate the recent victory of its Cricket Team over Australia, the first in 18 years.

The stamps are being issued in $1^{\rm st}$ Class and 68 pence, 2 of each denomination, and depict images of the England Cricket Team. It is the first time recognizable living people other than members of the British royal family have featured on British stamps.

The stamps feature players celebrating as Michael Vaughan holds the Ashes urn aloft, Captain Pietersen and player of the series Andrew Flintoff celebrating the wicket of Adam Gilchrist on the opening day of the first Test, the teams in action, and Vaughan running with bat in hand.

Royal Mail also issued stamps to mark England's rugby union World Cup victory in 2003 and London's successful bid for the 2012 Olympics, though neither featured individuals.

In July 2005, golfer Jack Nicklaus became the first living non-royal to feature on a British banknote when Royal Bank of Scotland Group Plc released a 5-pound note to commemorate his final professional appearance in the British Open at St. Andrews.
