NEW STAMPS RELEASED

BIMAL ROY

K Noorjehan, Principal Chief Postmaster General, Maharashtra Circle released a commemorative postage stamp on the legendary film director, Bimal Roy on January 8, 2007 at Mumbai in a function jointly organized by the Department of English, University of Mumbai & Bimal Roy Memorial & Film Society. The stamp in the denomination of Rs 5, the inland letter rate, was issued in Roy's $41^{\rm st}$ anniversary of death. Professor Vijay Khole, Vice Chancellor, University of Mumbai presided over the function that was also attended by Sulochana, Dharmendra, Sitara Devi and others of the Indian film industry.

Bimal Roy was one of the directors who took Indian cinema at an international platform at a very early stage. Inspired by neo-realistic Italian film The Bicycle Thief, he made Do Bigha Zameen in 1953, a film about the agricultural laborers in India. This film won awards and accolades in international festivals like the Cannes and the Karlovy Film Festival. Later, he went on to make Bengali hits from Sarat Chandra's works like Parineeta and Devdas(1955).

Roy was born in Dhaka, now in Bangladesh, on July 12, 1909. He entered the field of cinema as a cameraman. During this time, he assisted director P C Barua on the hit 1935 movie Devdas, starring K L Saigal. In the 1940s and 1950s Roy was part of the parallel cinema movement in post-war India. He was famous for his romantic-realist melodramas that took on important social issues while still being entertaining. He was a filmmaker of great and in-depth understanding of human strengths and weaknesses.

Bimal Roy is idolized by aspiring filmmakers till date.

Bharati Mirchandani designed the Stamp and the First Day Cover. Alka Sharma designed the pictorial first day postmark. Brochure containing write-up and technical data was issued on the occasion. The First Day Cover and the Brochure are priced at Rs 2 each. Security Printing Press, Hyderabad printed the stamps by Wet Offset in the quantity of 0.4 million.

TAMIL NADU CRICKET ASSOCIATION

Dayanidhi Maran, Minister for Communications & Information Technology released a commemorative postage stamp to mark the platinum jubilee of the Tamil Nadu Cricket Association (TNCA) on January 26, 2007 at Chennai. He also released a book titled The Romance of Tamil Nadu Cricket written by former cricketer V Ramanarayanan."

The Minister presented the first stamp to Indian cricket captain Rahul Dravid and the first copy of the book to master batsman Sachin Tendulkar. Most of the members of the Indian cricket team, several former cricketers and office-bearers of the TNCA were present.

Tamil Nadu Cricket Association (TNCA) is the governing body of the Cricket activities in the Tamil Nadu state of India and the Tamil Nadu cricket team. It is affiliated to the Board of Control for Cricket in India. TNCA is involved in the conduct of the game from the grass root level to the International level.

TNCA promotes and develops Cricket by conducting various League Tournaments, Tournaments for the age group Under-13, Under-15, Under-17, and Under-19, Under-22 and Under-25 categories besides organizing and conducting National Tournaments. The Association conducts SPIC-TNCA League Championship for City affiliated Clubs and 726 league matches are played a year from First division to Fifth division. A zone consisting of 12 teams each figure in the first and second divisions, whereas third, fourth and fifth division consists of two, three and four zones respectively. The city league format is one of the best in the country especially in first division where league matches are played on three-day duration as per the Ranji Trophy guidelines.

Corporate sponsorship alone in the first division runs to over Rs.60 million towards players' allowances, cricket equipments, ground maintenance etc besides participation in outstation tournaments.

There are also 28 affiliated District Cricket Associations in Tamil Nadu, where cricket is conducted in a highly systematic and professional manner. There are 780 participating clubs in the districts where tournaments are also conducted for different age categories. Free balls and mats are supplied by TNCA to the Districts every year.

M A Chidambaram Stadium at Chennai sports one of the worlds best cricket grounds including excellent features such as a Giant Video screen / Flood lights, Air-conditioned corporate boxes, Air-conditioned press box befitting any International stadium.

Brahm Prakash designed the Stamp and the First Day Cover. Nenu Gupta designed the pictorial first day postmark. Brochure containing write-up and technical data was issued on the occasion. The First Day Cover and the Brochure are priced at Rs 2 each. Security Printing Press, Hyderabad printed the stamps by Wet Offset in the quantity of 0.4 million.

FAKE STAMP SCAM UPDATES

The sordid saga, dubbed by some as Telgi II, continues.

J B Paper Mill, New Delhi obtained a contract to manufacture watermarked paper in 1987. India Security Press (ISP) supplied the mill with dandy roll, a device, for manufacturing the stamp paper. This device remained with the mill all this while till an internal audit at ISP recently discovered that it has not been received back while the contract was over several years ago. ISP officials rushed to Mill's address only to realize that the mill and its directors have disappeared meanwhile and are now untraceable. They then had no option but to go to police with their complaint.

Delhi police is now looking at possible links with the Telgi scandal since that revolved around the abuse of watermark paper as well.

The implication of this is enormous. It is entirely possible that this device was being used to produce tonnes of fictitious stamp paper, stamps or other security documents, setting the scene for another Telgi-type multi-billion scam leading to grave consequences for the security of the country
