NEWS & ANNOUNCEMENTS

NEW MINISTER FOR COMMUNICATIONS & IT

Dayanidhi Maran, Minister for Communications and Information Technology resigned on May 13, 2007. The President of India, as advised by the Prime Minister, accepted his resignation from the Council of Ministers, with immediate effect on May 15, 2007. A Raja, Minister of Environment & Forests was moved to the Ministry of Communications and Information Technology. The Prime Minister will look after the Ministry of Environment & Forests.

Maran was the youngest in the Council of Ministers. He was a nominee of a regional political party, Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (DMK) that is a partner in the ruling coalition government in India. He is the grandson of DMK President and Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu, M Karunanidhi's sister.

Dinakaran, a Tamil daily owned by Kalanidhi Maran, the elder brother of Dayanidhi, published a series of opinion polls. One of the polls showed that Karunanidhi's younger son M K Stalin was way ahead as Karunanidhi's successor with 70% votes whereas his elder brother M K Azhagiri was polled only 2%. The Madurai office of Dinakaran was fire bombed resulting in the death of three employees on May 9, 2007 by a mob allegedly supporters of Azhagiri. Maran reportedly told Home Secretary, Tamil Nadu State Government that he would go to the President of India if the "real culprits" responsible for the attack on his newspaper were not arrested. This is believed to have angered Karunanidhi and triggered his expulsion from the DMK and from the Council of Ministers.

SANDEEP NARAD, Indore Release a postal stamp commemorating the senior most journalist of Madhya Pradesh and freedom fighter, the late Shree Hukum Chand Narad.

The late Shree Hukum Chand Narad was an eminent journalist famous for his fearless pen. His whole life was devoted toward relentless fight for Indian freedom. He was known to the former prime minister Jawahar Lal Nehru as a fellow congress worker and was counted amongst the top rungs of the then C.P. & Barar leadership after almost a half century of his sudden death in M.P., government installed his life size bronze statue in Jabalpur in 1999 commemorating his service to the nation.

In 2008 falls the 105 birth anniversary of Shree Hukum Chand Narad, the doyen of the working journalist. It would most befitting for the post and telegraph department of the government of India to release a stamp in his memory which would serve as an inspiring tribute to patriotism and fearless journalism.
