P R Krishnan from Coimbatore has devised a system to monitor the price movement of Indian Post Independence stamps similar to the workings of Stanley Gibbons for the British Stamps. To start with only mint stamps are being included in his 'Philsensex' where the base is January 2007.

INDIA COIN & FLAG ON UN STAMPS

The United National Postal Administration (UNPA) issued a set with the National flags and typical coins of 24 member countries, including Indian flag and Rs 5 coin on May 3, 2007.

The stamps are in the denominations of US\$ 0.39, CHF 0.85 and \leqslant 0.55 based on the standard postal stamp prices in the locations of UN offices in US, Switzerland, and Austria. The stamps are issued in three sheets, consisting of two panes of four stamps each of eight different coins and flags. 8 stamps for 8 nations each is issued in one currency. The India is part of the sheet issued in US currency and other nations included are Brazil, Thailand, South Africa, Vietnam, Ecuador, Barbados, and Republic of Korea.

The stamps are designed by Rorie Katz and printed Cartor Security Printing (France) by Offset process in the quantity of 1 million stamps (125,000 sheets).

This is the second consecutive year of the stamp series representing the coins and flags of Member States of the United Nations. The series is expected to run for approximately eight years until all 192 Member States are represented.

WORLD'S FIRST CD-ROM STAMPS

2008 will be an auspicious year for the tiny Himalayan Kingdom of Bhutan. Bhutan will celebrate 100 years of its hereditary monarchy and crown its 5th King, His Majesty Jigme Khesar Namgyel Wangchuck, who will guide the country as it becomes a constitutional democracy and enters an exciting new era in its history.

To honor these events, Bhutan Postal Corporation, in conjunction with Creative Products International, of USA is pleased to announce the advance release of its 2008 Commemorative Stamp Issues. For this occasion, Bhutan has chosen to produce a unique first of a kind CD-ROM stamp that will deliver in sight and sound the message of this country's most historic year.

The president of Creative Products International, Frances Todd Stewart, is the daughter of the late Burt Kerr Todd, whose legacy includes his creative efforts on behalf of Bhutan to produce a series of extraordinarily unique stamps, including the popular record stamp in 1973, still treasured by collectors today.

Bhutan's 100th Anniversary of the Monarchy collection includes: 2 - CD-ROMs covering the 100-year anniversary of Bhutan's monarchy and Bhutan's preservation of its landscape and wildlife. 5 - Limited edition, self-adhesive paper stamps featuring Bhutan's five hereditary Kings.

BEST JOINT ISSUE OF 2006

Austria Post and Hong Kong Post are the recipients of the 2006 Best Joint Issue award for the Fireworks issue released on August 22, 2006. It was designed by Adolf Tuma (Austria) and Arde Lam (Hong Kong) and was printed by Österreichische Staatsdruckerei (Austria).

Second place was awarded to Finland and Sweden for the Suomenlinna issue released on May 4, 2006 and the Third place was awarded to Canada and the United States for the Champlain issue released on May 28, 2006. The selection was made among 32 joint issues released in 2006 by 57 postal administrations representing 49 countries for a total 148 stamps and 34 souvenir sheets. Omnibus and territorial issues were excluded from the contest.

The contest is organized by the International Philatelic Society of Joint Stamp Issues Collectors (IPS-JSIC) and its members vote for the awards.

YAHOO CLOSES AUCTION SITES

Yahoo has decided to close down its US and Canada auction sites with effect from June 16, 2007. These sites will continue to accept listings up to June 3, 2007. The last day to bid or buy is June 16, 2007 and the customer service will be available up to October 29, 2007. The decision does not impact its auction sites in Hong Kong, Singapore and Taiwan. The company says that it will better serve their customers through other Yahoo! Properties such as Yahoo Shopping, Yahoo Classifieds, and Yahoo Small Business.

Yahoo Auctions was launched on September 14, 1998 and did not charge a listing fee or a percentage of the sale price. It seems that all wasn't well with Yahoo Auctions which is believed to have 0.2 percent online auction market in US while eBay sites have virtual monopoly with about 94 percent.

EBAY BANNED 10 SELLERS OF FAKE AUSTRALIAN STAMPS By Glen Stephens, Sydney, Australia

The big news to buyers of stamps on eBay in recent months is that you may well have been buying FORGED stamps/overprints/perfins.

A group of collectors and dealers have combined to smash a ring of TEN inter-connected eBay handles who had been selling \$10,000's of forged stamps on eBay.

Please take time to read over these pieces if you buy off eBay, and if you have bought ANYTHING from these TEN CROOKS in recent months you have done your money is my guess - they are gone - along with your dough. Let it be a lesson - buy pricey stamps from REAL dealers who are here next month, and next year - not rip-off cons like these:
