The recently concluded BANGKOK 2007 remained open for 10 days. In this age of instant everything, it will indeed appear too long. However there was good reason for this long duration; Thai Post who funded the show, selected the dates and the duration to include 2 weekends and the national holidays on the occasion of Queen's birthday. All Thai Post counters were busy with queues all day long on all the days. The show timings were extended by 2 hours, from 10 AM to 10 PM, from August 9 to accommodate the buying public.

May we ask all stakeholders in India to work towards a similar success at the next international show.

NEW STAMPS RELEASED India Post released a set of two stamps and a miniature sheet on August 9, 2007 to commemorate the First War of Independence of 1857. Two

The stamps artistically depict the two pitched battles at Lucknow and Kanpur focusing on unknown soldiers on Rs 5 and Rs 15 respectively.

The First Day Cover depicts the dawn of the new nationalism symbolized by the rising sun; the guns whose greased cartridges provided the immediate catalyst. The First Day Cover also depicts a part of the constitution drafted by the sepoys.

India Post also issued two maxim cards on this occasion depicting war scenes, adopted from murals and tribal paintings from Madhya Pradesh.

Shankha Samanta designed the Stamps and Bharti Mirchandani the First Day Cover. Alka Sharma designed the pictorial first day postmark. Brochure containing write-up and technical data was issued on the occasion. The First Day Cover and the Brochure are priced at Rs 2 each. India Security Press, Nasik printed the stamps by photogravure in the quantity of 0.8 million each. The miniature sheet is printed in the quantity of 0.4 million.
