NEW STAMP RELEASED

India Post released a postage stamp in the denomination of Rs 5 to commemorate the centenary of Maharashtra Police Academy on November 3, 2007.

Maharashtra Police Academy was established in 1906 at Pune as Central Police Training School. It was shifted to Nasik, its current location in 1908. It was renamed Police Training College in 1960 after bifurcation of Bombay Province in to Maharashtra and Gujarat States. In 1990 it was upgraded and once again renamed as Maharashtra Police Academy.

Kamleshwar Singh designed the Stamps and the First Day Cover. Alka Sharma designed the pictorial first day postmark. Brochure containing write-up and technical data was issued on the occasion. The First Day Cover and the Brochure are priced at Rs 2 each. India Security Press, Nasik printed the stamp by photogravure in the quantity of 0.4 million.

INPEX 08 - AN UPDATE

We have not heard from the organizers on the several issues raised in the lead story in this Digital Weekly Issue #312 of October 25, 2007 regarding INPEX 08. One of the many issues we raised was the glaring omission of the ban on display of archival material of India. The organizers soon after have quietly, without acknowledging that this issue has been raised publicly, inserted an incomplete and unclear note at an inappropriate place in the Bulletin on the web site and pasted a slip to the same effect in printed copies of the Bulletin. It seems raising the issues did impact somewhat even though without an acknowledgment of the fact that the issue was raised by this Digital Weekly.

The text of the note inserted reads as follows: All colour proofs, colour trials, progressives and other security materials generated during the course of designing and production of a stamp will not be displayed. This ban will be applicable to all such security (sic) materials relating to special / commemorative / definitive stamps issued/being issued by the Department since 15.08.1947. This ban was extended upto 30.06.2006 and will continue for a period of five years from 01.07.2006.

The wording of this note is very ambiguous and strangely leaves out archival material of all postal stationery issues of India since August 15, 1947. This note is mischievously inserted below para 4.2.2 Traditional Philately as if to reemphasize that it affects only this particular class and the exclusion of all other classes from application of this ban. This note should have come in at the end of Clause 5 - Eligibility and Qualifications for Participation in the Bulletin as provided for in the Model Bulletin included in the India Post Handbook on Philatelic Exhibitions. The India Post Regulations for Philatelic Exhibitions also provide in Clause 6.12 that every exhibitor will abstain from exhibiting material that does not conform to the laws of the land. The legal restrictions and/or the details of the items not acceptable at exhibitions under patronage, recognition or support of India Post shall be published in Special Rules of the exhibition.

The list of items not acceptable is also not included in the INPEX 08 Bulletin. The legal restrictions as provided for in the laws of the land include, for example, the bogus issues in the name of Nagaland, and Khalistan, the stamps where the boundaries of India have not been shown correctly, the unissued stamp on Guru Granth Sahib, and similar philatelic products.

The printed copies of the INPEX 08 Bulletin started arriving after the mailing of Issue # 312 of October 25, 2007 of this publication. Interestingly the first mailing of the Bulletin used the list of Philatelic Organizations in India from www.stampsofindia.com and once again but not surprisingly without permission and acknowledgement! It would be great to find out who supplied this list to the organizers?

It has also come to notice that the publication of Bulletin for INPEX 08, making its many details public was purposely delayed to avoid or at least make difficult any legal action against the exhibition. Watch this space for more disclosures.

India Post is organizing the State philatelic exhibitions for Bihar, Uttar Pradesh, Kerala, Punjab, Delhi, and probably some others after November 15, 2007 - the last date for submitting entry forms for INPEX 08. It is therefore logical to extend the last date not only for submitting entry forms abut also for holding INPEX 08. There is no reason why India Post must rush thru either a state or national instead of organizing it properly to provide maximum mileage for promotion of philately and benefitting maximum number of collectors. In fact India Post should be cautious especially after the sad and bad experience of INPEX 93 the last national it organized.

RAKHI ENVELOPES After a search of 4 long months the remaining 2 of the 11 Rakhi envelopes released this year have been located.

THE RAG TAG WORLD OF INDIAN PHILATELY by Anil Dhir, Bhubaneswar (Anil Dhir is a philatelist, philatelic author and member of several philatelic organizations including PCI of which he is a life member.)

The present state of Philately in India can be well described as being in its last throes of life. It is just gasping to stay alive- thanks to the persons at the helm of Indian Philatelic, the pseudo philatelic group managing the Philatelic Congress of India.

This preponderance of geriatrics that control Indian Philately and are wont to let the control be wrested out of their clique has resulted in India being pushed much lower down the ladder in the world philatelic community.

It is time a serious rethink was done and action needs to be taken to bring Indian Philately back on the rails. India Post too must take note of the sorry state of affairs of PCI and use its good offices to intervene and improve matters.

The old mandarins of PCI should take note that it is time to come out of the degeneration and look beyond. It seems that the only activity that the PCI is indulging is in the appointment of Commissioners and Jury members. Can PCI cite even one single act or deed that has been done to promote the cause of philately in India since the last six years? The "you scratch my back and I scratch yours" syndrome that is endemic since the days of the D N Jatia has ensured that the original clique of a dozen or so remain at the helm. The fact that most of these grand panjandrums have sold off all their collections is another matter. Should philately be in the hands of a selfish few that are suffering from a great sense of self-aggrandizement?

INPEX 2008 should be an opportunity when both philatelists and India Post should decide on the future of PCI. Maybe it is time to sound the Last Post and call it a day. All Philatelic Associations and Clubs across the country should decide on an alternate nodal body, an entity that shall not be based on Individuals, but for the cause of Philately. I am sure that there are many likeminded philatelists who too have similar views.

The old has to give way to the new, just as night gives way to day and summer gives way to winter. Old horses should be let free to graze, however if they still insist to run races, they ought to be dealt with in an appropriate manner. Some persons just do not know that it is time to say goodbye, that they have overstayed their hospitality, that they should hang up their gloves, and that they should take retirement. In the game of one-upmanship there are no winners, everybody loses, more so the organization.

The music in this film was given by R D Burman. So this disc jacket should not have been included on the brochure. Such mistakes should be avoided by India Post. The details to be included in the information sheet for design and text must be checked properly through reliable resources before printing.

HISTORY OF POSTAL COMMUNICATIONS IN INDIA, PART 6 By Sangeeta Deogawanka

Part 6 - MEDIEVAL INDIA (1030 - 1757 AD) Structure of the postal systems in Mughal period

With the advent of the Mughals, a milestone was erected in the history of Indian postal communications. The following section is entirely devoted to the study of the evolution of an organized postal route in India during the Mughal period.

The Arabic and Persian travelling historians attributed the foundation of a steady postal system to the Mughal rulers, in particular, Babar, Akbar and other rulers of the period such as Sher Shah Suri. This was possible because of rapid development of roads and administrative reforms undertaken by them.

Much later, the General Post Office established at Fort William of Bengal presidency in 1774, also owed its origins to the Central Postal Department in use by the Mughal emperors. However the Imperial system is often erroneously believed to be the precursor of the modern postal system, as it brought the entire country under one umbrella postal structure.

The author wishes to further evaluate this perception, giving detailed accounts of how uniform postal reforms and systems were evolved under the Mughal rulers stretching right upto the Deccan in the South. At the same time, parallel postal systems operated in local kingdoms or states and the European trade centres being established in India. Thus a milestone was erected with the uniformity of postal methods and routes under Mughal rule, with establishment of provinces (sarkars) and districts (parganas) right up to the Southern stretches of India.
