India Post supported the recently held Stamp Show at the Outram Club, Kolkata by providing display frames, and a philatelic sales counter but very strangely did not accede the request to provide the special postmarks. The special covers were eventually postmarked with permanent pictorial postmark of Kolkata General Post Office.

Today in one part of the country it is possible to get special postmark sponsored on virtually any subject while in other parts India Post asks the sponsors to demonstrate sufficient connection to the event or item being commemorated. And even furnishing all documents and complying with all provisions of the rules in some parts of India the special postmarks may still not be approved. In some parts detailed design credits are allowed on the front of the cover, in some parts on the reverse of the cover, and in some it is not allowed at all. The list of such anomalies will fill volumes.

These rules at present can be interpreted in many different ways and in worst case scenario on whims and fancies of the person interpreting it.

India needs a national philatelic policy document along with a manual of rules and procedures and its uniform implementation all over the country.

PREMATURE ISSUES ALERT

In the Issue # 329 of February 21, 2008 we reported the availability in the market before the official release of Jasmine issue which has been issued on April 26, 2008.

We also exhorted India Post to take strict action against all postal officials responsible for this sorry state of affairs to prevent reoccurrence of similar episodes in future. But it seems no action has been taken so far.

The result is that now two issues, Bismillah Khan stamp postponed from April 3, and Indian Coast Guard miniature sheet for which no date of issue is announced, are openly available for sale and purchase on internet.

There is no issue/s expected to be released during the Week.

As you can see that the world is moving at very fast pace and we are still bringing out an issue only after 7 long days. JASMINE SCENTED STAMPS RELEASED Minister for Communications & Information Technology A Raja released a set of 2 postage stamps and a miniature sheet on April 26, 2008 at Chennai.

This the third issue of scented stamps after Sandalwood in 2006 and roses in 2007.

Jasmine or Jessamine (Jasminum) (from Persian yasmin, i.e. "gift from God", via Arabic) is a genus of shrubs and vines in the olive family (Oleaceae),with about 200 species, native to tropical and warm temperate regions of the Old World. The majority of species grow as climbers on other plants or on structures. The leaves can be either evergreen or deciduous, and are opposite in most species; leaf shape is simple, trifoliate or pinnate with up to nine leaflets.

In Sanskrit it is called "Mallika". In north India it is known as Juhi, Chameli, Mogra, and in South India it is called Kundumalligai and Mallepoovu. In India Jasmine is also called the 'Moonshine in the garden'.

Jasmine flowers are generally white, although some species have yellow flowers. Unlike most genera in the Oleaceae which have four corolla lobes ("petals"), jasmines often have five or six lobes. They are often strongly and sweetly scented. Flowering is in spring or summer in most species.

Its flowers are used to flavor Jasmine tea and other herbal or black tea. Its oil is also used in creams, shampoos and soaps. In India Jasmine flowers are stringed together to make garlands. Women in India wear this flower in their hair. Many species also yield an absolute which is used in the production of perfumes and incense.

Suresh Kumar designed the Stamps and the First Day Cover. Alka Sharma designed the pictorial first day postmark. Brochure containing write-up and technical data was issued on the occasion. The First Day Cover and the Brochure are priced at Rs 2 each. India Security Press, Nasik printed the stamps by photogravure in the following quantities: Rs 5 - 1 million, Rs 15 - 3 million, and miniature sheet - 0.5 million.

ARMY POSTAL ORDERS

The Army Postal Service launched a new product 'Field Postal Order' on March 2, 2007 that was its 35th anniversary. These are available in 6 denominations, Rs 2,000, Rs 3,000, Rs 5,000, Rs 10,000, Rs 15,000 and Rs 20,000. This was reported in Issue # 287 of May 3, 2007 and Issue #284 of March 22, 2007.

Recently the design of these postal orders was changed. We will be able to report the exact date of issue later. The first design, it appears, has been in use for less than a year. Naturally very few examples will be in collector hands, due both to their brief period of existence and to their very high cost

INDIAN EXHIBITS FOR ISRAEL 2008 In the Issue # 332 of March 13, 2008 we reported that national commissioner for TAIPEI 2008 the 21st Asian International Stamp Exhibition, held from March 7-11, Taipei, Taiwan did not follow the Department of Culture's Guidelines of June 18, 1999 regarding exhibits going in and out of the country and consequently the Department of Culture did not issue a no objection certificate.

Apparently the case of ISRAEL 2008 World Stamp Championship being held from May 14 to 21, 2008 at Tel Aviv, Israel was also processed along with TAIPEI 2008 and met the same fate.

Thereafter the national commissioner for ISRAEL 2008 filed a writ petition in the Delhi High COURT against Union of India and others. Hon'ble Justice Rekha Sharma on April 30, 2008 passed an order wherein the respondents submitted that pending the disposal of the writ petition, they agree to allow the petitioner to visit Israel to participate in the World Stamp Championship subject to certain conditions. The petitioner agreed to abide by the conditions and was instructed to give an undertaking to this court in form of an affidavit.

Mar 28-30: Bhopal, district philatelic exhibition

Mar 25-26: Kota, district philatelic exhibition Arun Saxena, Divisional Manager - Western Central Railway inaugurated the 2nd district philatelic exhibition on March 25, 22008 at Kota. Kota Postal Division organized the 2 day show at the Community Hall, P & T Colony. The jury members, senior philatelists N K Jareth of Kota along with A K Gupta of Jaipur, judged the exhibits displayed in 84 frames. M L Kalra, Vice Chancellor of Kota University awarded First Prize in Senior Group to Kalilur-rahman, 2nd Prize to Shubham Lodha, and 3rd Prize to P K Patni. In the Junior Group Akshita Dandona, Archit Gupta, Anshul maurya won the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd prizes respectively. The show was visited by hundreds of visitors and India Post's Philatelic counter sold stamps worth Rs 22,000. Two special covers, one on each day, were released on this occasion.

Apr 18-20: Kolkata, Stamp Exhibition at Outram Club Outram Club launched its yearlong Platinum Jubilee Celebrations on April 17, 2008. The first activity taken up by the Club was Stamp Show organized in collaboration with Bharatiya Daktikit Sangstha. The Club closed one of its Bars to provide space for the show.

The show featured a part of the famed philatelic collection of Dipok Dey on World Cinema, along with cinema exhibits of Souvik Roy, and Subhasis Sarkar, Fabulous Calcutta Memorabilia Collection of Gopal Biswas, and Vasundhara Deogawanka's Stamps of Amazing Shapes and Materials.

Son of the legendary film maker Satyajit Ray and director, Sandip Ray inaugurated the show on April 18, 2008. He released special cover and a stamp booklet featuring Satyajit Ray and legendary Actor Uttam Kumar. He confirmed that Satyajit Ray collected stamps and he grew up with Stanley Gibbons Catalogs and Strand Stamp Albums.

Deputy Consul General of Russia, Igor Karvaev released a special cover and a stamp booklet featuring Devika Rani on April 19, 2008.

A stamp booklet featuring Hollywood Actor Charlton Heston was released on April 20, 2008.

The Special covers on sports and cinema theme were released in the quantity of 150 only and at Rs 50 a piece were sold out in no time. The booklets containing stamps worth Rs 50 were priced at Rs 100 each and released in the quantity of 500 individually numbered units. All covers and booklets were designed by Dipok Dey.

The show concluded with felicitation of Madhukar Deogawanka for winning the Grand Prize of the Championship Class and Vishwanath Jhunjhunwala for winning gold medal, both at INPEX 2008 India National Philatelic Exhibition.

There were 11 Dealers Booth doing brisk business. The club hosted daily lunch for collector and dealer participants as well as for the visitors and Bharatiya Daktikit Sangstha hosted a Cocktail Dinner at conclusion of the show.

The management of Outram Club went all out to make participation and visiting the stamp show a pleasant and memorable experience and deserve the applause of philatelic community.

It has become a fashion everywhere to release a Special cover for any occasion. (Thank God, Special Covers are not allowed to be released for marriage Anniversary celebrations). The basic aim of release of any special cover is to commemorate certain events. In this regard Department of Post has prescribed rules and procedure to follow before release of Special covers, but it is seen in many occasion that no such rules or regulations are followed by the organizers. The covers and cancellation used are not related in many cases. The issue of Special Covers and cancellation are decided at the last moment and preparation is made in haste, making the cover as well as cancellation ugly. The cancellation are illegible, the printing of covers are made in thin papers with poor quality of printing. Also the sizes of the envelopes are not uniform, either long or wide making it a headache for the exhibitor, how to mount in the exhibition sheet. The basic question is that if the theme and cancellation of release is not under stood by the buyer / exhibitor, than the whole idea of issuing a special cover is defeated making it a seer waste of money and time. In some cases the cancellation cachets are lying with the organizer for their future use (Reasons better known to them). More over the local organizer's interference in preparation of special cover and cachet through local printer and seal makers are the main reason for such disappointing features. At least the cancellation should be legible showing the motif and date of cancellation. Any way the final sufferer is the philatelist who is paying the price for the covers. Ajit Kumar Dash, Editor of "THE FILA CAPSULE" has written in January- February'2008 issue about the official rules to be followed by the organizations who are intending to issue special covers. But in many cases non compliance of guidelines of INDIA POST are making the whole concern. Beside this more such write up is requiring to guide the future organizers.

We as philatelist can teach lesson to these organizers. All philatelists with unity make it a principle, that we will not buy such special covers which are of no use for the philately theme, so that future special covers will be released after much care and with compliance of proper rules and regulations. More over thematic issue of Special covers will benefit the philatelist and purpose of philately can be served.
