NEW STAMPS RELEASED

NATIONAL GIRL CHILD DAY

Minister of Communications and Information Technology, A Raja released a commemorative postage stamp in the denomination of Rs 5 on the occasion of the National Girl Child Day being observed for the first time in India on February 5, 2009 at New Delhi.

On January 19, 2009 the Government of India declared January 24 as the National Girl Child Day. It is the day when Indira Gandhi was sworn in as the first woman prime minister of India in 1966.

Suresh Kumar designed the Stamp and the First Day Cover. Alka Sharma designed the pictorial first day postmark. Brochure containing write-up and technical data was issued on the occasion. The First Day Cover and the Brochure are priced at Rs 2 each. India Security Press, Nasik printed 0.8 million stamps by photogravure process.

SANTAJI JAGNADE

India Post released a commemorative postage stamp in the denomination of Rs 5 on Santaji Jagnade on February 9, 2009.

Suresh Kumar designed the Stamp and the First Day Cover. Alka Sharma designed the pictorial first day postmark. Brochure containing write-up and technical data was issued on the occasion. The First Day Cover and the Brochure are priced at Rs 2 each. Security Printing Press, Hyderabad printed 0.4 million stamps by wet offset process. MAHA KAVI MAGH India Post released a commemorative postage stamp in the denomination of Rs 5 on 8th century Sanskrit poet Magh on February 9, 2009. Maha Kavi (Great Poet) Magh is known for his epic poem Shishupal Vadha (The Slaying of King Shishupal) that is noted for its intricate wordplay, and textual complexity. The 19th canto contains the following stanza which is an example of what has been called "the most complex and exquisite type of palindrome ever invented". It yields the same text if read forwards, backwards, down, or up: sa-kA-ra-nA-nA-ra-kA-sakA-ya-sA-da-da-sA-ya-kA ra-sA-ha-vA vA-ha-sA-ranA-da-vA-da-da-vA-da-nA. The up-and-down reading depends on re-reading the text back up again in each column. The stanza translates as: [That army], which relished battle (rasAhavA) contained allies who brought low the bodes and gaits of their various striving enemies (sakAranAnArakAsakAyasAdadasAyakA), and in it the cries of the best of mounts contended with musical instruments (vAhasAranAdavAdadavAdanA).

Nenu Gupta designed the Stamp and the First Day Cover. Alka Sharma designed the pictorial first day postmark. Brochure containing write-up and technical data was issued on the occasion. The First Day Cover and the Brochure are priced at Rs 2 each. India Security Press, Nasik printed 0.4 million stamps by photogravure process.
