NEW STAMPS RELEASED

### BABURAO PULESHWAR SHEDMAKE

M E Haq, Post Master General, Vidarbha Region, Maharashtra Circle, India Post released a commemorative postage stamp in the denomination of Rs 5 on Baburao Puleshwar Shedmake, a revolutionary from Gond tribal community who revolted against the British rule in 1857, on March 12, 2009 on the occasion of his 176th birth anniversary at Chandrapur.

Alka Sahrma designed the Stamp, the First Day Cover and the pictorial first day postmark. Brochure containing write-up and technical data was issued on the occasion. The First Day Cover and the Brochure are priced at Rs 2 each. Security Printing Press, Hyderabad printed 0.5 million stamps in the sheets of 30 by wet offset.

## K K BIRLA

Sonia Gandhi, Chairperson of the ruling coalition in India, the United Progressive Alliance, released a commemorative postage stamp in the denomination of Rs 5 on noted industrialist K K Birla on March 13, 2009 at New Delhi. The function was presided over by External Affairs Minister Pranab Mukherjee while Minister of State for Communications and Information Technology Jyotiraditya Scindia was the guest of honor. Also present at the function were Ministers P Chidambaram, Vayalar Ravi, H R Bhardwaj, Anand Sharma, former minister Oscar Fernandes, chief ministers Sheila Dikshit and Bhupinder Singh Hooda, senior Congress leaders M L Fotedar, J P Aggarwal, Jayanthi Natarajan, Jagdish Tytler, Sajjan Kumar and Sachin Pilot.

Bharati Mirchandani designed the Stamp and the First Day Cover. Alka Sharma designed the pictorial first day postmark. Brochure containing write-up and technical data was issued on the occasion. The First Day Cover and the Brochure are priced at Rs 2 each. India Security Press, Nasik printed 0.4 million stamps in the sheets of 40 by wet offset process.

### NEW SECURITY FEATURE

The K K Birla commemorative issued on March 13, 2009 is the first commemorative printed by the India Security Press Nasik by Wet Offset process. The stamp also has an added security feature that it has "I.S.P. 09" printed vertically on the right side of each stamp. However this is visible only when the stamp is viewed at a particularly angle. This is not ultra violet or fluorescent

As we all are well aware that in any philatelic exhibition, an exhibit containing errors - perforation, color difference & omissions, cuts, misprints, etc. are given more marks then a exhibit containing healthy material. By no way we mean a healthy variety of a philatelic item.

This approach is making our hobby unreachable for new comers as well as majority of the existing collectors. This type of material is not only too costly but is very difficult to get. But giving more marks to such material by the judges has made them a must in every exhibit. Many errors like color proofs, color trials, artist drawings with signature etc., have been announced as illegal by many a countries, but their absenteeism in an exhibit makes it a poor one. No doubt these materials are good for study & research purpose, but for exhibition purpose.....?.

A philatelist with complete & through knowledge of his subject coupled with healthy material & healthy varieties & philatelic knowledge, & with a beautiful presentation with good plan, gets less marks due to the fact that he has not put some errors in his exhibit. And a poor exhibit gets better marks just due to the fact that it contained some errors, which are not even allowed legally by the Postal Department.

According to us this practice should be stopped. There can be a separate section for error exhibits in an exhibition, if so needed, but in no way it can be compared with a Healthy exhibit.

Much can be written on this issue, but we think we have made the point clear.

If majority can agree, rules for evaluation can be changed.
