In this era where information plays a very important role and is so easily disseminated we find it quite strange that almost no information is coming forth about philatelic forgeries. While rapid technological developments have been misused by unscrupulous persons to create dangerous forgeries with much more ease. It is a cottage industry manufacturing products on demand. Thus items that were earlier hard to be seen are now available in quantity such as pigeon post covers or Azad Hind high values.

In the realm of modern and as such undocumented area, the fake overprint 'Specimen" on postal stationery is a common problem. In the days gone by, high value first day covers such as Gandhi 1948 issue used to be number one suspect where postmarks were extensively forged. The forgeries of special covers and special postmarks are abounding.

Misleading and deceptive advertising is another region that requires buyers' attention. Some stamp booklets are neither booklet nor there is any data available about their origin. Several maxim cards on offer do not qualify as maxim cards at all. Also being sold are homemade presentation packs without being described as such.

No questions are being asked about foreign stamps particularly on Indian topics that are being sold in Indian philatelic markets that whether these have actually been issued by the country whose name is inscribed on stamps or whether these are bogus issues.

We hope that all of us will take note of the realities of today's market and share and circulate the information available on frauds, fakes, and forgeries. We are committed to host the information base online and assist with documentation.

INDIAN COPYRIGHT ACT 1957 Following information regarding application of the Indian Copyright Act has been added to "Indian Laws Relevant to Philately" section of

www.stampsofindia.com:

The stamps are not mentioned by name however Section 28 is applicable in this case. The provisions therein state that any Government work goes out of copyright 60 years after publication into public domain. Images of Indian stamps older than 60 years, the years 1947, 1948 & early 1949 thus are out of copyright and already in public domain. The stamps still under copyright can only be shown as per permissions/conditions laid down by India Post on their website.

Section 28. Term of copyright in Government work.- In the case of Government work, where Government is the first owner of the copyright therein, copyright shall subsist until Sixty years from the beginning of the calendar year next following the year in which the work is first published.
