Suresh Kumar designed the Stamp and the First Day Cover. Alka Sharma designed the pictorial first day postmark. Brochure containing write-up and technical data was issued on the occasion. The First Day Cover and the Brochure are priced at Rs 2 each. Security Printing Press, Hyderabad printed 0.4 million stamps by wet offset process.

I had come across a paragraph in this digital weekly # 390 issue & it is produced below:

"DR AVINASH B JAGTAP, Binningen, Switzerland

As now many people, not necessarily philatelists, who have entered into this field of stamp collecting, have spoiled this hobby. There is no control over the dealers who make money by exercising all types of forgeries and those who have no knowledge of philately are prepared to buy any type of material offered to them."

I collect stamp as a hobby & the above view of Mr Avinash B Jagtap from Switzerland had given a bad taste. All the philatelists start collecting stamp as hobby & then they become philatelists. Mr. Jagtap is no exception. He himself had admitted that he had purchased forged stamp some couple of decades ago. Being a philatelist when he can get dupe, how can he blame the people who are collecting stamp had spoiled this hobby. Stamp collector like us had kept this hobby alive. We don't sell stamps, we are the buyer & not sellers \ dealers. I had come across lot of philatelist who are also dealers \ sellers.

As a philatelist Mr Jagtap himself had supported forgeries & is a victim of forgery. Expert like him could not immune himself from forgery, so he should not blame the stamp collectors. Stamp collectors had indeed made it a live hobby. Hope, such personal opinion of few individuals do not stand true.

# SHABBIR KHAMBATY

I was reading the mail that was written by Dr Jagtap of Switzerland in Stampsofindia website. And I also read your side of the argument.

But, if one deeply thinks about it, Dr Jagtap is absolutely right about the commercialization of philately. Buying and selling of philatelic material is acceptable, as philately is produced by Postal Authorities. But, if any philatelic organisation or person is allowed to issue

booklets or maxcards, that doesn't have the official backing, and that would lead to chaos.

You mentioned that Mr Dipok De, a renowned person in the world of philately, has made a positive contribution to the world of philately. There's no denying that. But what is the way to stop any other person who tries issuing booklets just for making money. I mean, let's say if I want to make some money, I can also issue a booklet. There needs to be a way to curb this kind of activity.

Again, I am not against capitalism. But then, how is the Indian collector, who is not fully aware due to lack of proper communication from the postal department, whether the booklet is genuine or not.

Again, I just hope whatever happens, happens for the best of philately.

DR AVINASH B JAGTAP, Binningen, Switzerland Thank you very much for publishing both of my view-points in "Stamps of India Collectors Companion" No.390.

- 1. You are correct that you reported about two stamp booklets and not one.
- 2. Unfortunately there was a grave mistake on my side, that instead of "for sale", I wrote "for sell" I did not write that personally you or your news bulletin offers such privately created stamp booklets for sale; but the private persons or organizations offer these to enthusiastic collectors (not necessarily philatelists) at philatelic exhibitions.
- 3. Stamp Booklets form a special philatelic element in a thematic display at national or international philatelic exhibitions. So the advertisements on the covers of these stamp booklets, ranging from costumes, automobiles & motorcycles, Cigars & Cigaretts, drugs and drinks, all these can be shown in a thematic display. These are most welcome addition to a thematic display, provided the stamp booklets are issued by the official postal authorities of the countries which are UPU members.

I know that at certain philatelic exhibitions in Germany and Switzerland the candidates were disappointed that the Jury had deducted their points on the account that they showed some booklets which were not officially issued postal stationery items. I agree fully with your remark that the privately prepared postal items, such as FDCs, Maximum Cards, or Stamp Booklets are far more superior to and attractive than those produced by our India Post. I have high esteem for Mr. Deepak De for his art.
