It is our privilege to have Rajesh Paharia of Jaipur to be our Guest for this issue. We reproduce his thought provoking editorial from the Mar-Apr 2009 issue of Philanews, bimonthly publication of the Philatelic Society of Rajasthan.

"Recently Mr Vijaya Mallaya has bought Mahatma Gandhi's personnel belongings for hefty amount in foreign auction and opened a Pandora box of discussion. This column is too small to discuss whether it is legally right or wrong but I believe that everybody will agree that at least our heritage has come back to India. Government is still not clear on this takeover and there are lots of ambiguities but Kudos to Mr Vijaya Mallaya.

Similar ambiguity regarding Philatelic Material like Proofs, Artists Sketch, Color Trials etc of Post Independence period also exists. Many rare Indian Materials are egularly offered by Foreign auctions. An Australian vendor is currently selling Gandhi Nehru 1973 - 7 copies of color trials at ebay.com. The item no is Z150337929327.

An American Auctioneer thru his mail bid sale no 35 under name of France International has offered Set of 4 Artist Design of Inpex Bhubneshwar Turtle stamps. The Design cards are duly stamped and signed by Manager, Security Press Nasik. Although such materials is banned from display in Indian Stamp exhibitions but every expert Philatelist have a strong desire of holding such material since the relative importance of such material in Philatelic World and satisfaction of possessing something rare in ones collection urge all stamp collectors to collect such material. It's a proven fact that collections which posses such material get appreciation and high awards in International Exhibitions. Post Independence Indian subject collectors are deprived

of such material display and this is why no Post Independence collection of India has ever won highest award in last 60 years in any exhibition outside India.

It is not clear that How, Why & When this rule has been implemented but it is said that this has been done to discourage theft of such material from Postal records. This indirectly means that if government is not able to stop the theft of Statues from Temples than they will stop devotees to pray god or go to temples and lock them to prevent theft. There are legal ways to stop illegal pilferage of such material but simply illegalizing the entire opportunity and field is not only injustice on collectors part but it is also indirectly supporting the people who are involved in this malpractice.

Today, such material is openly offered in various auctions and it can be bought legally with valid payments of taxes and documents by collectors. If such material is of national importance and government feels that it has been stolen than they should come back to government than a criminal case should be registered. Legal action should be taken against people who have done this act and should be punished for it."

STAMP WATCH

On April 29, 2009 India post issued a set of 5 stamps on Spices of India. These stamps were printed in 6 se-tenant strips per issue sheet. Only one block of 4 in a sheet is possible and it is learnt from the brochure that the printed quantity is only 0.4 million stamps. This means maximum of 400,000 se-tenant stripes only are available. In my opinion this is a good item for the future.
