Sep 27: Dushyant Kumar

Rameshwar Thakur, the Governor of Madhya Pradesh released a commemorative stamp in the denomination of Rs 5 at Bhopal on September 27, 2009 on Dushyant Kumar, writer of fiction, drama, poetry, particularly of gazals in Hindi.

Brahm Prakash designed the Stamp, and the First Day Cover. Alka Sharma designed the pictorial first day postmark. Brochure containing write-up and technical data was issued on the occasion. The First Day Cover and the Brochure are priced at Rs 2 each. India Security Press, Nasik printed 0.4 million stamps by wet offset process in the sheets of 40.

### FORGERIES & FRAUDS ALERTS

- 1. Further to reports of a bogus postmark of Bombay Philatelic Bureau applied on a maxim card of Marconi issue of India of 1974 in issue # 411 and 412 we have been informed the identity of seller by several readers. The seller is Puneesh Ahuja puneesh\_ahuja@rediffmail.com.
- 2. SG O-16, and O-17, being eBay Items # 120475332550, and 120475333418 were sold for a song, US\$ 200 each. Another eBay item 120474840040, ending on October 3, from the same seller is listed with the starting price of US 150. This purportedly is SG 0-18. All these items are identified with incorrect SG catalog numbers but described as genuine by the seller who also adds that item 'Might be reprint, Probably less than 10 exist without ends being cut off, Quite rare, Mint Original Gum with Hinge remnant'. Consider the facts that SG does not even list complete stamps in Mint for 2 Annas and 8 Annas, SG 0-16 and 0-18, and for 4 Annas SG 0-17 complete stamp is not listed even in the Used! The SG catalog price for 0-16 and 0-18 for used is GBP 15,000 and 18,000 respectively. SG however does not price Official Reprints or Government Imitations which are priced in Phila India 2008 catalog at Rs 1,000 (about GBP 12) each. However the experts we consulted were of the opinion that these items are not even that but forgeries.

The Miniature Sheet on Heritage Railway Stations of India is a very big and probably the biggest one with about 12" x 6" size. The Postal Department is not taking any care while preparing the design. They should at least think of a philatelist as to how he will display these big Miniature sheets and how it can be used on a cover? Can the Department of Posts will provide any such big cover for affixing this Miniature Sheet for postal use? May I request the Philatelists to give their views on how to sort out this problem?

AN APPEAL TO THE PHILATELIC COMMUNITY - Anil Dhir, Bhubaneswar

Please read this short piece and help serve a philatelic cause.

I have lost track of a cover which was in the collection of the Late Jadunath Kanungo of Cuttack. It was a damaged cover posted from Jammu around the turn of the century (circa 1898-1905) and addressed to "The Rich Merchant of Cuttack". It was an ordinary cover with a common stamp. I had seen the cover in Jadunath babu's collection a few years back and he had promised to give it to me. However, in philatelic eccentricity, he took his own sweet time to do so. My repeated requests would yield the reply that he had lost track of it in him huge collection.

I had got a color scan of the cover, and it had intrigued me. The address was just mentioned as "The Rich Old Merchant of Cuttack", the letter had been delivered. I had done a lot of follow up and found out who the rich merchant to whom it was addressed to was. I had also followed up the story till Jammu and traced the descendents of the person who had sent the cover. The letter had been sent by a coconut wholesaler, who used to import coconuts all the way from Orissa. The coconuts for the Vaishno Devi temple used to be sent all the way from Orissa, in a journey that entailed transportation by bullock carts, train, boats and finally ponies. My efforts also yielded a lot other aspects, which made a very good study in Postal history. My desire was to write a short monograph on the cover.

I had last met Mr. Jadunath Kanungo during EIPEX held at Bhubaneswar in October 2008 where he was felicitated with the lifetime achievement award for philately by Eastern India Philatelic Association and was given honor by the Governor of Orissa. After the ceremony, I had once again asked him about the cover, and to help him search for it I gave him the color scan (the only one I had). He promised to go thru his collection and give me the cover. I insisted on paying him a price there and then, and he very reluctantly accepted Rs 250 for it. I kept on reminding him of it for the next two months until one day on the 7th December he rang me up and said that he had got the cover and I could come over and collect it. As I was away from Bhubaneswar, I told him that I would collect it the next week.

Unfortunately on the 9th December Jadu babu passed away. His death was swift and sudden and we lost a great philatelist. I attended the funeral at Cuttack, the thought of the cover was still in my mind.

I did not broach the subject of the cover to Mrs. Kanungo for some time, but did enquire about what she would do with the collection. She did not have any immediate plans to dispose off the collection. However, when I approached her after a couple of months, she told me that she has already sold the entire collection to dealers in Kolkata. The collection was taken by her brother who sold it to different dealers in Kolkata. I have been desperately trying to locate the cover since, but to no avail.

I will pay a very good price for the cover as it has a lot of value for me as I have put up a lot of efforts for my research. To any other collector it is just a non-descript cover, of not much value. My appeal to anyone who has the cover is to at least let me have a color scan of it.
