However even the jurors were not able to see the exhibits in the case of the one in Vadodara in 2009 and they had to judge with the black and white photocopies which made for some erroneous judgments.

It is very easy for everyone to criticize India Post but we also need to point out the shortcomings in shows organized by the philatelists and supported by India Post. In public private partnership it should be clear to both partners what they bring to the table.

The details about the forthcoming national exhibition are being provided later in the issue and the success of this national exhibition in Delhi depends on your support.

STAMPS OF INDIA NATIONAL EXHIBITION

Bharatiya Daktikit Sangstha, Kolkata is organizing a national philatelic exhibition 'Stamps of India National Exhibition' from December 10 to 12, 2010 at NSIC Exhibition Ground, New Delhi.

Founded in 1979 and incorporated in 1990, the Bharatiya Daktikit Sangstha, has earlier organized a national philatelic exhibition in Kolkata in 1990. 'Stamps of India National Exhibition' is the 2nd national being organized by the Bharatiya Daktikit Sangstha who also had organized philatelic exhibitions in 1979, 1980, 1981 at Kolkata besides a stamp show at India International Film Festival 1994 at Kolkata, and 2 stamp shows at Mumbai - including one sponsored by National Film Development Corporation.

This will be the first national being organized in Delhi after a gap of 29 years. The earlier shows were organized by India Post including the first ever national philatelic exhibition in India in 1970, and the 4th national in 1982.

JOBURG 2010 INTERNATIONAL STAMP SHOW

The 26th Asian International Stamp Exhibition, 'JOBURG 2010 International Stamp Show' will be held on October 27 to 31, 2010 at Johannesburg, South

Africa. The exhibition is also open to select countries of Europe and USA that have historic relations with South Africa in additions to countries in Asia. JOBURG 2010 will have all exhibit classes - Traditional, Postal History, Postal Stationery, Aerophilately, Astrophilately, Maximaphily, Revenue, and Thematic Philately subdivided as - A) Nature, B) Culture, C) Technology, and Youth Philately class subdivided by age as of January 01, 2010 -

- 1) Collectors aged 13 to 15 years,
- 2) Collectors aged 16 18 years,
- 3) Collectors aged 19 21 years, and

Literature class subdivided into:

- 1) Philatelic books, pamphlets and studies (issued after January 01, 2005),
- 2) Philatelic journals, periodicals (issued after January 01, 2008),
- 3) Stamp catalogues (issued after January 01, 2008), and

One-Frame Exhibit Class subdivided into - A) Traditional, B) Postal History, C) Postal Stationery, D) Aerophilately, E) Astrophilately, F) Thematic, G) Maximaphily, H) Revenue.

JOBURG 2010 will also have 'Open Class' as an Experimental Class. Exhibits in this Class can include material from any other competition class plus non-philatelic material. The exhibit must contain at least 50% philatelic material. The non-philatelic material should not overwhelm the philatelic material. Awards will be made as per One-Frame Exhibits.

There is no participation fee for Youth Philately Class. The participation fee for other Competitive Classes (except Literature, and One-Frame Exhibit Classes) will be US\$35 per frame. The fee for participation in Literature is US\$35 per exhibit. The fee for participation in One-Frame Exhibit is US\$70 per exhibit.

It had 'Inda' instead of 'India' in the Reserve Bank of India. Consequently India Post has withdrawn the same and replaced it with the corrected version.

STATUS OF THE GERMAN SPECIAL POSTMARK ON GANDHI

Ketan Patel of Fremont, California investigated about the status of special postmark on Gandhi dated Oct 2, 2009 from Winnenden, Germany. Following is the links on eBay for this item:

Patel contacted German Post and philatelists in Germany regarding this and everyone confirmed that this is not a postmark issued by German Post.

Jutta Frimberger, Premium Service Philatelie, Deutsche Post AG, Niederlassung Philatelie, Weiden replied that Deutsche Post AG did not issue any postmark from Ghandi's birthday.

Anna Girbert, Deutsche Post AG, Niederlassung Philatelie, Stempelvertrieb, Weiden replied that The postmark is not a postmark from the German Post. You can recognize this, because there are no posthorns on it. I am sorry, the person who has created the postmark is unknown.

We contacted Rajesh Verma, a senior philatelist and Gandhi philately specialist in Germany and he replied that As far as I could with my resources find out is that a certain stamps club brought out its own cancellation on 2nd October, 2009 on occasion of international non-violence day as a protest against the massacre which took place on 11th March 2009 in Winnenden High School in which 16 students and teachers were killed. The German post has

permitted to use it only for one day i.e. on 2nd October 2009. Hence according to me these covers are not fake but correctly used with correct postage and postal bar code. False cancellation can be made but postal bar code can no one make or copy. Moreover, here post being private there is no communication between the post offices. So it can be possible that what Winnenden post is doing is not known to the post in Berlin or Frankfurt.

PAYPAL SUSPENDS SOME OPERATIONS IN INDIA

PayPal has suspended local bank transfers and personal payments to and from India with effect from February 6, 2010 to respond to enquiries from the Indian regulators, specifically questions on whether personal payments constitute remittances into India. The regulators recently let PayPal know about revised licensing rules that PayPal are now actively engaged in securing. Personal payments to and from India will be suspended for at least a few months until the matter is fully resolve the questions from the Indian regulators.

During this time, customers can still make commercial payments to India but merchants cannot withdraw funds in Rupees to local Indian banks.

PayPal assures that the customers should be able to withdraw their funds to a local bank within the next few days. In the meantime, they are going to restore the amount of recent attempted withdrawal back into PayPal balance so that customers can know that their money is safe in their account. The balance is being restored within 24 hours. In addition, customers will see another reimbursement of any withdrawal fees charged. PayPal will also ensure that customers are not adversely affected by currency fluctuations during the last week. This additional reimbursement(s) should cover the difference between the attempted withdrawal-amount and the amount-restored by PayPal into the accounts.
