India Security Press, Nasik printed 0.3 million stamps by wet offset process. The miniature sheet was printed in the quantity of 0.2 million.

India Post released a stamp in the denomination of Rs 5 on Yashwantrao Chavan, freedom fighter and political leader on December 22, 2010.

Alka Sharma designed the Stamp, the First Day Cover, and the pictorial first day postmark. The First Day Cover and the Brochure are priced at Rs 2 each. India Security Press, Nasik printed 0.3 million stamps by photogravure process.

Bhausaheb Hiray

India Post released a stamp in the denomination of Rs 5 on Bhausaheb Hiray, freedom fighter and educationist on December 22, 2010.

Alka Sharma designed the Stamp, the First Day Cover, and the pictorial first day postmark. The First Day Cover and the Brochure are priced at Rs 2 each. India Security Press, Nasik printed 0.3 million stamps by wet offset process.

It was a great experience for me to visit Delhi and take part in the National Exhibition of stamps of India. It also gave me an opportunity to meet you and Mr Jhingan and also lot of Philatelic enthusiasts and senior philatelists. The frames made for the exhibits are fantastic. In fact I may say

because of the great frames the exhibits got a new touch which every one enjoyed and also the exhibits looked good.

As mentioned to you I request for future exhibitions kindly see that a that a copy of the synopsis(a spare copy of which can be asked from the exhibitors) of the exhibit is given to the Jury so that justice is done to the exhibitors. The impression that I got when I interacted with some of the Jury is that they could not read the introductory pages as the height was more, and in the bargain some of the exhibits were not understood. To sort out this problem I feel the exhibitor can be asked to explain the exhibit for 5 minutes so that the jury can understand the exhibit from the view of the exhibitor, and if it is not permissible, the exhibit can be asked to give a spare copy of the synopsis so that it can be given to the jury.
